Changes to the English requirement

- Bachelor of Biomedical Science and
- Bachelor of Biomedical Science / Bachelor of Engineering

There is an increase in the English requirement from a study score of 25 to 30.

The modified prerequisites are:

'Units 3 and 4 - a study score of at least 30 in English (Any) and a study score of at least 25 in chemistry and in one of physics, mathematical methods (either) or specialist mathematics.'

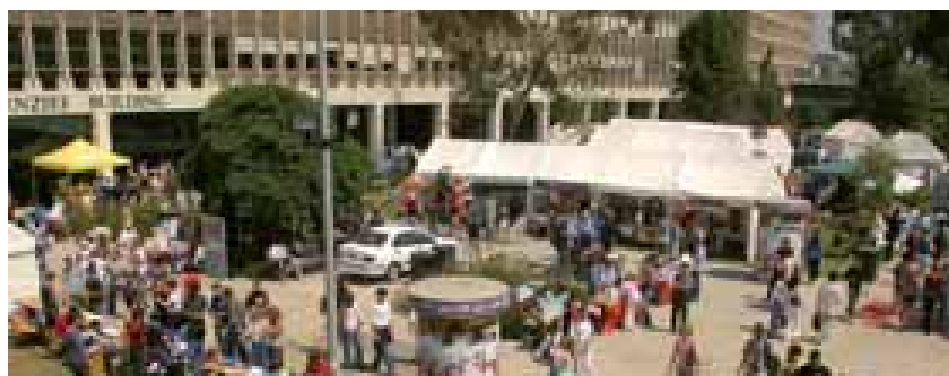
